The joint council meeting for the Tama and Toledo City Council met Monday November 18, 2019 at 5:00 PM in the Tama City Council Chambers. Mayor Carnahan called the meeting to order with the following council member answering to roll call: McAdoo, Haughey, Ray, Tyynismaa, Babinat. Toledo Mayor Lloyd had the following Council Members answering roll call: Sokol, Boll, Vesely, Graham. Absent: Pansegrau. Visitors: Jamie Upah, Kendall Jordan, Jake Jacobson, Jermi Kopsa, and other guests.

John Cook with the U.S. Census was unable to attend the meeting.

Jamie Upah, representative of the Tama-Toledo Aquatic Center informed the Councils of the 2019 season. They had a profitable year. The change in group passes was a success. There are a few expenses coming up which include roof repairs, platform to water slide, and chlorine analyzers. The Board thanked the City of Toledo for their continued maintenance along with the Tama Clerks for their work with the financials this year.

Jermi Kopsa, representative for the STC REC Board, updated the Councils on the 2019 seasons. There were 755 children registered this year with income of \$40,760 and expenses of \$35,307.

Jake Jacobson, representative for the Rec Trail Board informed the Council that the board is in good shape although they didn't have any major expenses or revenues this year they are satisfied with where the trail is right now.

Toledo City Clerk informed the Councils of the current firework contributions. The City of Toledo has increased the firework budget to \$8,000 and are requesting the City of Tama consider contributing \$4,000. The City of Tama currently contributes \$2,500. The City of Tama will consider raising the donation and inform Toledo.

Tama Public Works Director, John Lloyd approached the Councils about entertaining the idea of combining water services or purchasing bulk water from the City of Toledo. The City of Tama is currently in need of either replacing, repairing or combining services. Councilmen Boll would like to see committees from both City's get together to discuss the feasibility of this option after the first of the year.

It was moved by Ray, seconded by Babinat to adjourn at 5:33 PM.

Parker Johnson with Snyder and Associates and Julie Winter with Region 6 discussed the Levee accreditation. The Federal funding for the construction portion of this project is on a first come first serve passes which puts a sense of urgency on Snyder to perform the necessary preliminary work in order to apply for the grant funding. It was moved by Ray, seconded by Haughey to approve the contract with Snyder and Associated in the amount of \$150,400 to be paid from the reserve. Roll call vote all ayes. Motion carried.

It was moved by Babinat, seconded by McAdoo to approve the testing of 3 wells by Water Systems Engineering Inc. in an amount not to exceed \$4,500.00. Roll call vote all ayes. Motion carried.

Public Works Director, John Lloyd updated the Council on the potential DNR funding. The funding requires the City to be above the required limits before we become eligible. We will try to apply in March of 2020.

Foreign exchange student Deep Kaur presented a slide show to the Council educating them on her homeland of Pakistan.

John Lloyd updated the Council on the current nuisance properties. Some properties have been cleaned up; others still are in need of work. Two properties have requested extensions that have not yet been granted. Lloyd would like the Council to consider fining repeat offenders.

The City Clerk presented the cost and information on purchasing timeclock software. The Council would like to see some information gathered on overtime and see if there are reports we could use to address overtime and justifications for it

It was moved by Babinat, seconded by Tyynismaa to approve the FY19 Annual Financial Report. Roll call vote all ayes. Motion carried.

The Council lifted the burn ban from November 18 thru December 2. The Council wanted to make sure to remind citizens that no accelerants are to be used while burning.
