

October 7, 2019

The regular meeting for the Tama City Council met Tuesday October 7, 2019 at 6:00 PM in the Tama City Council Chambers. Mayor Carnahan called the meeting to order with the following council member answering to roll call: Haughey, Ray, Tyynismaa. Absent: McAdoo and Babinat. Visitors: Randy Fairchild, Richie Jimenez, Darvin Graham, Jeff Large.

It was moved by Ray, seconded by Haughey to approve the consent agenda which consists of minutes from the last regular meeting on 9/16/19, bills paid 9/17/19 thru 10/4/19, bills to be paid 10/7/19, liquor license renewal for El Cerrito, and liquor license renewal for Caseys General Store. Roll call vote all ayes. Motion carried.

Discussion in regards to the hospital agreement with the ambulance service was tabled.

It was moved by Haughey, seconded by Tyynismaa to approve the Fire Department to move forward with the 50/50 grant to purchase nozzles, masks, and hoses. Roll call vote all ayes. Motion carried.

Babinat joined the meeting at 6:08.

It was moved by Ray, seconded by Haughey to support the Indigenous People Proclamation to be signed on October 14, 2019. Roll call vote all ayes. Motion carried.

The City Clerk presented information from New Century FS regarding the possibility of having fuel tanks installed at the City. The Council is in favor of getting tanks in the future if we can work it into the budget. The Clerk will do more checking and getting the logistics all straightened out to present to the Council.

It was moved by Haughey, seconded by Tyynismaa to approve Resolution No. 23-19, a resolution to approve the city of Tama block grant owner occupied housing rehabilitation for 508 Siegel St. Roll call vote: Ray, Tyynismaa, McAdoo, Haughey. Motion carried.

The Council discussed the possibility of modifying the City Code to include building permits again. The Council would like to discuss with John Lloyd details of the expectations.

The Council will be starting the meeting at 5 on October 21st to have enough time to discuss nuisance housing. The Council members will individually tour the town to make note of any progress that has been made.

The City Clerk informed the Council that there is a grant that is being worked on with Region Six to help with the cost of levee repairs.

It was moved by Babinat, seconded by Tyynismaa to lift the burn ban from October 7, 2019 until November 4, 2019 with the exception of October 31, 2019 when there will be no burning. Roll call vote all ayes. Motion carried.

It was moved by McAdoo, seconded by Babinat to set Trick or Treat night for October 31st from 5:00 PM to 7:30 PM. Roll call vote all ayes. Motion carried.

Reports: McAdoo- Would like to start checking into bidding on the Library repairs.

Mayor Carnahan- Would like to remind everyone of the Haunted Hayride on October 26th.

It was moved by McAdoo, seconded by Tyynismaa to adjourn. 6:53 PM
