A motion was made by Ray, seconded by Babinat to approve Resolution No. 8-18 a resolution adopting the Tama Source Water Protection Plan Phase 2. Roll call vote ayes: Tyynismaa, Babinat, McAdoo, Haughey, Ray. Motion carried.

It was moved by Babinat, seconded by McAdoo to approve Sue Harrington to fill Adam Anderson's Library Board term. Roll call vote all ayes. Motion carried.

It was moved by Haughey, seconded by McAdoo to accept the resignation of Jarade Purk as of 5/25/18 and to direct the City Attorney to draft a letter to Mr. Purk requesting reimbursement of \$6,655.26. A onetime payment to be remitted to the City within 30 days. Roll call vote all ayes. Motion carried.

It was moved by Ray, seconded by Babinat to approve Cooper Coffman to be hired as a police officer contingent on him passing his MMPI testing. Roll call vote all ayes. Motion carried.

It was moved by Babinat, seconded by Ray to approve raising the non-certified police officer salary to \$37,000.00. Roll call vote all ayes. Motion carried.

It was moved by Tyynismaa, seconded by Babinat to increase Jacob Kessler and Cooper Coffman's salaries to \$37,000.00 affective 7/1/18. Roll call vote all ayes. Motion carried.

The Haunted Hayrack ride has been scheduled for October 27, 2018. The Mayor also informed the Council of a project Mark McFate is doing in memory of his son.
