The regular meeting of the Tama City Council was held August 6, 2018 at 6:00 PM. Mayor Carnahan called the meeting to order with the following Council Members answering to roll call: McAdoo, Haughey, Ray, Tynismaa, Babinat. Numerous visitors present.

It was moved by Ray, seconded by Tynismaa to approve the consent agenda which consisted of minutes from the last meeting on 7/16/18, bills paid 7/16/18 thru 8/5/18, and bills to be paid 8/6/18. Roll call vote all ayes. Motion carried.

Don Weitzell and Duane Backen with the Ambulance Service approached the Council about getting permission to send out the letter they had drafted for a fundraiser towards the new ambulance they plan to be an agenda item at a later meeting.

It was moved by Tynismaa, seconded by Haughey to approve pay request #7 to Vieth Construction in the amount of \$944.66. Roll call vote all ayes. Motion carried.

It was moved by McAdoo, seconded by Ray to approve payment to Quality Roofing and Siding in the amount of \$31,755.00 for the CDBG housing grant at 504 Hall St. Roll call vote all ayes. Motion carried.

It was moved by Babinat, seconded by Tynismaa to approve Resolution No. 10-18, a resolution closing W 3rd St. for a street dance on August 31, 2018 from 6:00 PM to 11:30 PM with the bands performance ending at 11:00 PM. Roll call vote ayes: McAdoo, Haughey, Ray, Tynismaa, Babinat. Motion carried.

Ashely Aylsworth approached the Mayor and Council with a business plan she is proposing to start a fitness center in downtown Tama. The Council encouraged Ashley on the adventure and look forward to see more business downtown.

Babinat dismissed herself at 6:18 PM due to conflict of interest.

John Novak approached the Council with some concerns on nuisances. The Council appreciated Novak voicing his concerns.

Babinat returns to the meeting at 6:43 PM.

Anne Michael informed the Council on some recent training seminars she attended in regards to historic tourism. The Mayor thanked Anne for her continued support on the Lincoln Highway Bridge restoration.

Colleen Davis with the Lincoln Highway Bridge Park Association invited the Mayor and Council to the Abe Lincoln Dedication Ceremony at the Lincoln Highway Bridge Park on August 17, 2018 at 5:30 PM.

John Legg with the Library Board addressed the issue regarding the windows at the Library. The Council has directed Public Works Director, John Lloyd to start looking into the bidding process and to establish guidelines for bids.

The City Clerk informed the Council that we are now receiving rent in the amount of \$1,850.00 per month from Mercy Care Tama. The money is being put into the Economic Development Fund. The City Attorney is going to check into the City being insured on the building.
